Friends, Happy 250th Birthday to you!

I hope you have all received and read the special collaboration of Surviving Spouse topics of interest that was sent to you. There is another quite lengthy booklet that is available to you on the MOAA website. The publication is "The Day After Calls".

When I needed this information, it had not yet been compiled. But a dear friend used it last year, when her father-in-law died. Even though both she and her husband and father-in-law are retired Army officers, she found it invaluable. It is lengthy, but might come in very handy.

Thinking about what to write about concerning Independence Day, I came across an interesting book review "Founders in Sync" by Meghan Cox Gurdon, in the Wall Street Journal. The book she reviewed is A PERFECT COINCIDENCE by Jim Rasenberger. It's a story of a very unlikely coincidence. Meghan describes the book as "a delight, a sparkling work of narrative nonfiction that acquaints the reader with the thoughts and doings of two giants of American democracy, while telling the story of the founding of our fractious country". The book is published by Scribner and 496 pages and makes the case for the Divine Hand in the moving of American affairs,

Mr. Rasenberger writes of the on-off-on again friendship of Thomas Jefferson and John Adams. They meet in Philadelphia in 1775 and collaborate on the Declaration of Independence. Then they become Ambassadors and great friends. During a Presidential campaign, their relationship crumbles. They are enemies for a decade. As their age advances, they rediscover their friendship. Both die on the 50th anniversary of the Declaration. Oddly, another great contributor to our freedom, James Monroe died on July 4, 1831, five years later. A coincidence?

Florida MOAA Members Take Action Now to Protect Servicemember Pay During Shutdowns

We need you to Take Action now on the following MOAA campaign:

Protect Servicemember Pay During Any Future Shutdown (Shutdown Fairness Act).

The Shutdown Fairness Act would protect the pay of all uniformed servicemembers, including Drill Status Reservists, during any future federal funding lapse. MOAA supports this effort to end the recurring disruption, and financial uncertainty shutdowns create for servicemembers and their families and backs an amendment extending the same protection to U.S. Public Health Service and NOAA Commissioned Corps members.

How to Take Action on the Shutdown Fairness Act with MOAA

MOAA is actively advocating for the **Shutdown Fairness Act (S. 3168)** to protect the pay and benefits of servicemembers during any future federal government shutdown. The bill would allow the Pentagon and Department of Homeland Security to continue paying active-duty, Reserve, and National Guard members during funding lapses, ensuring readiness and retention are not undermined by financial uncertainty.

Why It Matters

Recent shutdowns have left tens of thousands of Coast Guard and other service members without timely pay, creating stress and hardship for families. MOAA warns that ongoing uncertainty not only harms morale but also risks retention, as servicemembers may consider other career options.

MOAA's Position

MOAA supports the Shutdown Fairness Act as a permanent fix to prevent servicemembers from being “pawns” in budget negotiations. They also call for amendments to cover U.S. Public Health Service and NOAA Commissioned Corps members

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Florida Veteran Legislation Signed by Gov DeSantis on June 26, 2026

Three veteran related Bills that were signed by Governor DeSantis on June 26th 2026:

HB 0199 Veterans Affairs by Maney

06/12/2026 Approved by Governor; Chapter No. 2026-128

Veterans Affairs; Revises admissions process for veterans treatment court programs; authorizes court, in consultation with multidisciplinary team, to determine eligibility for veterans treatment court programs; requires court to consider recommendation of state attorney when making eligibility determination; authorizes sentencing courts to divert defendants to veterans treatment court programs under certain circumstances; requires certain notice be provided to defendants; provides for disposition of probation or community control violations by program participants.

HB 0253 Veterans Dental Care Grant Program by Edmonds

06/25/2026 Approved by Governor

The bill expands eligibility for the Veterans Dental Care Grant Program established within the Florida Department of Veterans' Affairs. The bill effectively requires veterans to have an income of up to 400 percent of the federal poverty level to be eligible for the program. The department set the current program eligibility to veterans with incomes up to 300 percent of the federal poverty level by administrative rule.

SB 1602 Housing for Veterans by Wright

06/11/2026 Approved by Governor; Chapter No. 2026-125

The bill creates the "Homes for Veterans Property Management Incentive Pilot Program" within the Florida Housing Finance Corporation for Broward, Escambia, Hillsborough, and Santa Rosa counties. The bill directs the Florida Housing Finance Corporation, in consultation with the local public housing authority and case managers assigned to veterans by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, to establish and oversee the document requirements and all processes of the pilot program.

Purple Heart Day is August 7th

The Purple Heart was instituted in 1782 by George Washington and is the first American decoration. Originally it was awarded for bravery in action, currently it is awarded to those wounded or killed in action, in the latter case posthumously.

An Oak Leaf Cluster is added when a previously wounded person already has a Purple Heart. The decoration is a purple, heart-shaped badge with bronze edges. It depicts in relief a bust of George Washington wearing the uniform of a general in the Continental Army. On the reverse side is the inscription: "For Military Merit" with the recipient's name below. It is estimated that just for World War II 1,076,245 Purple Hearts were awarded.

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Central Florida Looking for World War II, Korean War and Vietnam War Veterans to Apply for Honor Flight to Washington, D.C. War Memorials on October 17, 2026 out of Sanford FL

SANFORD, Fla. – Veterans of World War II, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War can apply now for a free trip to Washington, D.C. through [Honor Flight Central Florida](#). Honor Flight Central Florida's Mission #37 is scheduled for October 17, 2026, flying veterans from the Sanford area to visit their memorials

The organization's next trip, Mission #37, is scheduled for October 17, 2026. Veterans will fly from the Sanford area to the nation's capital to visit their memorials. The welcome home celebration is expected around 10:00 p.m. at the airport. The flight is completely free for veterans.

According to Honor Flight Central Florida, veterans fly to Washington, D.C. at no cost to them. The trip includes motor coach transportation, meals, and any other amenities needed to travel comfortably. Complimentary wheelchairs, oxygen, and a paramedic staff will be available on the flight mission.

Guardians are needed, too.

Honor Flight Central Florida also relies on volunteer Guardians — donors who accompany veterans on every flight mission. Guardians cover their own travel and trip costs and are asked to assist and dedicate themselves to a veteran for the duration of the mission, including being prepared to push a wheelchair. Guardians can be no older than 65. According to the organization, it is not unusual for veterans to share their wartime experiences for the first time when they reach the memorials. When family members serve as Guardians, the organization says they gain a new appreciation for the legacy of service they will inherit.

The Ibogaine Florida Veteran Initiative

Our MOAA Chapter would like you to consider signing the petition for the **Operation Integration Act proposal**. The presentation provides a QR code and link to the petition (<http://bit.ly/4b8BkzA>) and see the attachment above.

Following President Trump's April 2026 executive order fast-tracking psychedelic therapies, our goal is to establish the necessary training and infrastructure in Florida. Given our state's high veteran population and status as a health destination, we have the opportunity to lead by implementing proactive guardrails and oversight before new clinics and providers emerge. The petition calls for dual-lane oversight from licensed healthcare professionals under the Florida Department of Health (DOH) and certified guides and recovery peers under the Florida Certification Board. Psychedelic therapies are already widely used in our state either underground or through entheogenic churches. The signing of the executive order and its

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upcoming codification will further accessibility nationwide. However, we must ensure our state is structurally prepared to serve our residents so that this doesn't become the next subscription drug.

There are currently 15 U.S. States advocating for the approval of Ibogaine as an alternative treatment for PTSD, TBI, and other Trauma-Related Conditions. The Florida for Ibogaine Coalition is a group of individuals and organizations dedicated to advocating for the medicalization of Ibogaine in Florida. They aim to support FDA-approved Ibogaine research and expand access to innovative treatment options for substance use disorder and mental health conditions. The Florida coalition is actively working to connect with legislators and congressmen to push for legislation and the inclusion of Ibogaine in the medical treatment of PTSD, TBI, and other trauma-related conditions. They emphasize the importance of a coalition approach to ensure the success of Ibogaine's potential in treating these conditions.

The July issue of Military Officer Magazine includes an article entitled "Healthy Living: The Medicine That Brought Him Home" relating to this issue.
